Fire Safety Tips: Wildfire Season



Prepare for wildfire.

Have an emergency bag of personal items ready in case you are asked to leave your home.

- Create a safety zone of up to 100 feet around your home.
- Remove pine needles and dry leaves from around your home.
- Keep woodpiles at least 30 feet from your home.
- Follow evacuation instructions from your local emergency officials.
- Hold community meetings and work with neighbors to prepare the neighborhood for wildfires.
- Practice two ways out of your neighborhood to prepare for a scenario where the roads may be blocked.
- Make sure driveways and house numbers are clearly marked and can be seen from the road.
- Meet with your local fire department and find out how department personnel can help you prepare for wildfires.

Remember to always stay aware of your environment, and if instructed by local emergency officials to evacuate, please do so. For more information and safety tips about wildfires, visit the U.S. Fire Administration website.

HURREVAC (short for Hurricane Evacuation) is a storm tracking and decision support tool. The program combines live feeds of tropical cyclone forecast information with data from various state Hurricane Evacuation Studies (HES) to assist the local emergency manager in determining the most prudent evacuation decision time and the potential for significant storm effects such as wind and storm surge. Many Emergency Operations Centers use HURREVAC as a situational awareness and briefing tool.
Per-335: Critical Decision Making for Complex Coordinated Attacks	Talbot County Community Center July 10-11	John.broaddus@maryland.gov	This course provides first responders from multiple disciplines with skills to manage the initial response to a large-scale attack in a chaotic environment during a complex coordinated attack (CCA). It aims to train responders in how to use intuitive skills such as observation, analysis, anticipation, and awareness to recognize the possibility of an attack involving multiple incidents of an extreme magnitude that inundate resources, exceed conventional tactics and strategies, and often require a joint response involving members from multiple disciplines and jurisdictions.

Assessments just do not happen when a disaster or emergency occurs. They require planning and training to support the planned activity if they are to realize their greatest potential. The Rapid Needs Assessment must be rapidly implemented by local governments. Assessment teams must be identified and trained together. The field teams need to be supported by personnel who can rapidly analyze the findings of the individual teams and presented to management to support prioritization and decision-making.

Course content includes an overview of the state system, legal concerns, SAR operations, search strategy & tactics, personal preparedness, wilderness survival, land navigation, and basic wilderness rescue.
