

L0449 Incident Command System Train the Trainer (TtT) Course

**Course Description:**

This course expands and improves the student's ability to deliver the Incident Command System (ICS) curricula. Students are provided training on the delivery of ICS-100: Introduction to the ICS, ICS-200: ICS for Single Resource and Initial Action Incidents, ICS 300: Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents, ICS-400: Advanced ICS for Command and General Staff—Complex Incidents, ICS-402 ICS Overview for Executives and Senior Officials and G0191, Emergency Operations Center/ICS Interface. A major emphasis placed on classroom based deliveries, including compliance with the National Incident Management Training Program, adult education methodologies, deployment of course activities, pre- and post-testing and ICS training program management.

Students will perform a teach back of an assigned unit(s) from the ICS core curriculum as part of the course. Teach backs are conducted as part of the assessment of instructor competence.

Prerequisite: REQUIRED.

- IS-100 Introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS) or attended a ICS 100 (ILT)
- ICS-200 Incident Command System (ICS) for Single Resources & Initial Action Incidents**
- ICS-300, Intermediate Incident Command System (ICS) for Expanding Incidents
- ICS-400, Advanced Incident Command System (ICS), Command and General Staff—Complex Incidents
- IS-700 National Incident Management System or attended a ICS 700 (ILT)
- IS-800 National Response Framework or attended a ICS 800 (ILT)
- Must be a certified instructor (New Jersey Division of Fire Safety-Level II, New Jersey Department of Health Advanced Instructor, New Jersey Police Training Commission Methods of Instruction, New Jersey State Police Instructor Training Course, Federal Emergency Management Agency Basic Instructor Certificate, Emergency Management Institute Instructional Presentation and Evaluation Skills (E-141) or Management of Supervision of Training (E-601) or Introduction to Instructional Design Methods (E-610), Center for Domestic Preparedness Instructor Training Course (PER-266), National Fire Academy (NFA) Educational Methodologies, National Wildfire Coordinating Group Facilitative Instructor Course (M-410), Teaching Certification or License (non state or agency specific), Instructional methods (Military School) or Other approved equal that addresses adult education/training, equaling 40 hours).

Note: ICS 100, ICS 200, ICS 300, ICS 400, IS 700 and IS 800. Students must have taken the Emergency Management Institute or US Department of Agriculture or National Fire Academy or National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) ICS courses. Other ICS courses will be reviewed for consistency with the ICS objectives prescribed by the NIMS Integration Center.

**For New Jersey Fire Service personnel – New Jersey Division of Fire Safety does not provide credit nor accepts online I-200. ICS 200b must be an instructor led (ILT) course.

Target Audience

The target audience for this course is emergency management personnel who may serve in or manage an emergency operations center, to include office of emergency management staff and administration, support function staff, representatives from municipal agencies/departments that may assist in the recovery process.

The target audience for this course includes the following local government positions and allied professionals:

- Emergency Manager and Staff
- Public Works Director and Staff
- Construction Code Enforcement / Inspector's and Staff
- Fire Prevention-Code Enforcement/Fire Marshal/Officials
- Community Planner and Staff
- Health Official/Care Administrator or Planner
- Public Information Officer
- Voluntary Agency Coordinator or Unmet Needs Committee Coordinator
- Business and Private Organization Representative

Selection Criteria:

Participants must have successfully:

- Completed the prerequisite courses
- Completed recognized training to achieve qualifications in techniques of instruction and adult education methodologies (examples listed in required prerequisites)
- Must qualify as either a "Lead or Unit" instructor as noted in the NIMS Training Program, September 2011 – that is, the student must demonstrate a working knowledge of ICS principles (must have worked as an Incident Commander, in a Command or General Staff position(s) on incidents, planned events, or exercises that went longer than one operational period or involved a written incident action plan and involved multi-agency coordination.)
- Service in an emergency management and incident response position within five years in real-world incidents, planned events, or accredited exercises that required a written IAP or encompassed more than one operational period. Recognized qualifications in techniques of instruction and adult education methodologies.
- Experience teaching emergency management material to adults.
- Emergency management experience in a multiagency environment.
